Result of Recommended Action: Adoption of this resolution will result in the Council approving the following:

- 8.4 **Subject:** Resolution Authorizing the City Manager to Execute a Construction Contract to North West Surfacing in an Amount not to Exceed \$161,205 for the Horn Road Sidewalk Improvements Project

Recommendation: Adoption of Resolution No. 14-2010.

Result of Recommended Action: Adoption of this resolution will allow work be performed under the construction contract and includes furnishing of all labor, materials, and equipment for construction of a new sidewalk, and pedestrian and ADA improvements on Horn Road from Old Winery Place to Routier Road. Construction improvements include: installation of new sidewalk and replacing the sidewalk ramps at the intersections of Old Winery Place, Business Park Drive, and Fite Circle; Replacement of storm drainage inlets and laterals to be removed from their current location in the middle of the sidewalk ramps and relocated as to not impact sidewalk ramps at the intersections.

Result of Recommended Action: Adoption of this ordinance will authorize an additional one-year suspension of permit fees for retrofit photovoltaic solar panels in residential buildings.

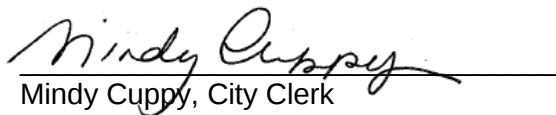
