WHEREAS, a General Municipal Election was held and conducted in the City of Rancho Cordova, California, on Tuesday, November 6, 2012, as required by law; and

ATTACHMENT 2**ORDINANCE NO. 14-2012****AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RANCHO CORDOVA ADDING CHAPTER 3.90 OF THE RANCHO CORDOVA MUNICIPAL CODE WITH RESPECT TO A CARDROOM TAX**

WHEREAS, the City recognizes that its cardrooms are a source of entertainment for people throughout the Sacramento region; and

WHEREAS, the City intends to be fair to all cardrooms by submitting, subject to City Council approval, a tax for voter approval which if approved would impose a similar tax on all cardrooms in the City; and

WHEREAS, California Constitution Article XIII C, Section 2, provides that no local government may impose, extend or increase any general tax unless and until that tax is submitted to the electorate and approved by a majority vote; and

WHEREAS, California Constitution Article XIII C, Section 2, provides that a measure proposing to impose, extend or increase a general tax must be consolidated with a regularly scheduled general election for members of the City Council; and

WHEREAS, November 6, 2012 is the date of the City's regular municipal election; and

WHEREAS, the cardroom tax imposed by this Ordinance will result in an equal treatment of all cardrooms in the City and will provide additional revenue to the City to help preserve funding for general municipal services such as neighborhood improvements and safety including, but not limited to, police services, maintenance of and improvements to city streets, sidewalks, landscaping and graffiti removal.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF RANCHO CORDOVA DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: Chapter 3.90, titled "Cardroom Tax," is hereby added to the Rancho Cordova Municipal Code to read as follows:

CHAPTER 3.90**CARDROOM TAX**

3.90.010 Short Title.

This chapter shall be known as the Rancho Cordova Cardroom Tax Ordinance.

3.90.020 Purpose and Intent.

This cardroom tax is a license tax on the privilege of operating a cardroom within the City of Rancho Cordova, and is enacted solely to raise revenue for municipal purposes and is not intended for regulation.

3.90.030 Definitions.

A. "Annual Gross Gaming Revenues" shall mean the Gross Gaming Revenues produced each calendar year between January 1st through December 31st. For new cardrooms, the first annual Gross Gaming Revenues shall begin on the date the certificate of the occupancy is issued for the cardroom and end on December 31st of that same year."

B. "Discontinued, dissolved or otherwise terminated" shall mean the date the cardroom is no longer in operation as described in the business license(s) issued to the cardroom by the City pursuant to Title 4 of this Code. The Finance Director, using all evidence, including evidence provided by the cardroom licensee, shall make the determination as to whether a cardroom has been discontinued, dissolved or otherwise terminated.

C. "Gross Gaming Revenues" shall be defined in accordance with the definition of "Gross Revenue" provided in California Business and Professions Code Section 19805(r) as may be amended from time to time..

D. "Licensee" means a person who has been issued a cardroom business license under Title 4 of this Code.

3.90.040 Payment of Tax.

In addition to any requirements imposed by Title 4 of this Code, each licensee operating a cardroom within the City shall pay the City a percentage of the cardroom's annual Gross Gaming Revenues received by the cardroom as follows: a tax of 2% of Annual Gross Gaming Revenues commencing on January 1, 2013, and in each year thereafter, a tax of 3% of Gross Gaming Revenues that are \$5,000,000, and a tax of 4% on Gross Gaming Revenues over \$5,000,000.00.

3.90.050 Statement of Revenue.

Before the 30th day following the end of each quarter, the licensee shall file with the City Finance Department a statement, under oath, showing the true and correct amount of annual Gross Gaming Revenue for the preceding quarter. A signed declaration shall be attached to the statement included therein, which shall be in substantially the same form as: "I hereby declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct." Pursuant to Section 3.90.070 of this Chapter, the City shall have the right to audit the matters reported in the statement to determine the accuracy of the figures contained therein.

ATTACHMENT 2**3.90.060 Payment – Timing.**

A. All taxes imposed by this Chapter shall be made at the same time the licensee files the statement of revenue with the Finance Department. Payment of taxes imposed by this Chapter shall accompany the statement of revenue and shall be in the correct amount of taxes due and owing in accordance with Section 3.60.040 of this Chapter. Such sums correctly reflecting the quarterly fees payable for the preceding quarter shall be accepted by the City, subject, however, to the City's right to conduct an audit pursuant to Section 3.90.070 of this Chapter.

B. In the case of a cardroom which is discontinued, dissolved or otherwise terminated before the expiration of a tax period, the due date for any taxes accrued and owing to the City under the provisions of this Chapter shall be the date of the discontinuance, dissolution or termination of the cardroom business.

C. Payments not received within 30 days of the end of the quarter will be subject to a late fee of one and one-half percent (1.5%) per month of the amount past due, plus all reasonable collection fees and costs.

3.90.070 Audit of Gross Gaming Revenue Reports and Payment.

A. The City shall have the right to audit the matters referred to in the statement of revenue, and to determine the correctness of the figures set forth in such statement and the amount payable to the City pursuant to the provisions of Section 3.90.040.

B. The books, records and accounts of any licensee may be inspected and audited by the City.

C. Such an inspection and audit may be performed by the Finance Director, a qualified accountant or City official who shall be selected by the Finance Director.

D. To facilitate such audits, the licensee shall keep complete records of all transactions related to the receipt or disbursement of funds arising out of or related to cardroom operations during the preceding three-year period. All such records shall be made available to the City for audit at the licensee's place of doing business after reasonable prior notice.

E. Any failure or refusal of any licensee to make and file a statement of revenue as required within the time required, or to pay such sums by way of taxes when the same are due and payable in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter, or to permit such inspection of such books, records and accounts of such licensee shall be and constitute full and sufficient grounds for suspension or revocation of any cardroom business license issued to the licensee pursuant to Title 4 of this Code.

3.90.080 Notice Not Required by City.

The City is not required to send a delinquency or other notice or bill to any person subject to the provisions of this Chapter, and failure to send such notice or bill shall not affect the validity of any tax, interest or penalty due under the provisions of this Chapter.

3.90.090 Tax Deemed Debt to City.

ATTACHMENT 2

The amount of any tax, penalties and interest imposed by the provisions of this Chapter shall be deemed a debt to the City, and any licensee carrying on any business without having paid the tax under this Chapter to the City shall be liable to an action in the name of the City in any court of competent jurisdiction for the amount of the tax, and penalties and interest imposed on such business.

3.90.100 Deficiency Determinations.

A. If the Finance Director is not satisfied that a statement of revenue filed, as required under the provisions of this Chapter, is correct, or that the amount of tax is correctly computed, the Finance Director may compute and determine the amount to be paid and make a deficiency determination upon the basis of the facts contained in the statement of revenue or upon the basis of any information in the City's possession or that may come into the City's possession.

B. The City may make more than one deficiency determination of the amount of tax due for a period or periods.

C. In the case of a cardroom which is discontinued, dissolved or otherwise terminated, a deficiency determination may be made at any time within three years thereafter as to any liability arising from engaging in such business whether or not a deficiency determination is issued prior to the date the tax would otherwise be due.

D. Whenever a deficiency determination is made, the City shall provide a notice to the person concerned in the same manner as notices of assessment are given under Section 3.90.120.

3.90.110 Tax Assessment; Nonpayment; Fraud.

A. Under any of the following circumstances, the Finance Director may make and give notice of an assessment of the amount of tax owed by a person under this Chapter:

1. If the person has not filed any statements of revenue required under the provisions of this Chapter;
2. If the person has not paid any tax due under the provisions of this Chapter;
3. If the person has not, after demand by the Finance Director, filed a corrected statement of revenue or furnished to the Finance Director adequate substantiation of the information contained in a statement of revenue already filed, or paid any additional amount of tax due under the provisions of this Chapter.

B. The notice of assessment shall separately set forth the amount of any tax known or estimated by the Finance Director to be due, after full consideration of all information within his or her knowledge concerning the cardroom business and activities of the person assessed and shall include the amount of any penalties, costs or interest accrued on each amount to the date of the notice of assessment.

3.90.120 Tax Assessment; Notice Requirements.

ATTACHMENT 2

The notice of assessment shall be served upon the licensee either by personally serving it to the licensee, or by a deposit of the notice in the United States mail, postage prepaid thereon, addressed to the licensee at the address of the location of the business appearing on the face of the business license(s) issued under Title 4 to the licensee, or to such other address as he or she shall register with the Finance Director for the purpose of receiving notices provided under this Chapter. For the purposes of this Section, a service by mail is complete at the time of deposit in the United States mail.

3.90.130 Tax Assessment; Hearing.

A. Within ten (10) days after the date of service of a notice under Section 3.60.120 of this Chapter, the licensee may apply in writing to the Finance Director for a hearing on the assessment.

B. If application for a hearing before the Finance Director is not made within the time herein prescribed, the tax assessed by the Finance Director shall become final and conclusive.

C. Within thirty (30) days of the receipt of any such application for hearing, the Finance Director shall cause the matter to be set for hearing before him or her not later than thirty (30) days after the date of application, unless a later date is agreed to by the Finance Director and the licensee requesting the hearing.

D. Notice of such hearing shall be given by the Finance Director to the licensee requesting such hearing not later than five (5) days prior to such hearing. At such hearing, said licensee may appear and offer evidence why the assessment as made by the Finance Director should not be confirmed and fixed as a tax.

E. After such hearing the Finance Director shall determine and reassess the proper tax to be charged and shall give written notice thereof to the licensee in the manner prescribed in Section 3.60.120 for giving notice of assessment.

3.90.140 Conviction for Chapter Violation; Taxes Not Waived.

A. The conviction and punishment of any person for failure to pay the required tax shall not excuse or exempt such person from any civil action for the tax debt unpaid at the time of such conviction.

B. No civil action shall prevent a criminal prosecution for any violation of the provisions of this Chapter or of any State Law requiring the payment of all taxes.

3.90.150. Amendment of Tax. Chapter 3.90 of the Municipal Code may be amended by the City Council without a vote of the people. However, as required by Chapter XIII C of the California Constitution, voter approval is required for any amendment provision that would increase the rate of any tax levied pursuant to this Ordinance. The People of the City of Rancho Cordova affirm that the following actions shall not constitute an increase of the rate of a tax:

ATTACHMENT 2

1. The restoration of the rate of the tax to a rate that is no higher than that set by this Ordinance, if the City Council has adopted an ordinance to reduce the rate of the tax;
2. An action that interprets or clarifies the methodology of the tax, or any definition applicable to the tax, so long as interpretation or clarification (even if contrary to some prior interpretation or clarification) is not inconsistent with the language of this Ordinance.
3. The establishment of a class of person that is exempt or excepted from the tax or the discontinuation of any such exemption or exception (other than the discontinuation of an exemption or exception specifically set forth in this Ordinance); and
4. The collection of the tax imposed by this Ordinance, even if the City had, for some period of time, failed to collect the tax.

SECTION 2. Effective Date. This Chapter shall become effective immediately upon the date that this Ordinance is approved by the voters of the City of Rancho Cordova at the Election of November 6, 2012 as confirmed by the City Council's declaration of the vote.

SECTION 3. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining portions of this Ordinance shall nonetheless remain in full force and effect. The people hereby declares that they would have adopted each section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, phrases, or portions of this Ordinance be declared invalid or unenforceable.

ORDINANCE NO. 18-2012

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF RANCHO CORDOVA
AMENDING SECTION 23.731.080 SPECIAL FENCING AND SCREENING
REQUIREMENTS OF THE RANCHO CORDOVA ZONING CODE
TO ALLOW ELECTRIC FENCES WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS**

WHEREAS, on June 21, 2012, the City of Rancho Cordova ("City") received an application from Electric Guard Dog ("Applicant") for a Zoning Code Amendment to allow and establish development standards for electric fences within the City; and

WHEREAS, the City's Zoning Code currently limits electric fences to be allowed in narrow, strictly defined circumstances; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Zoning Code amendment allows electric fences by right in the M-2 zone when entirely surrounded by M-2 zoning or upon issuance of an Administrative Use Permit by the Planning Director for electric fences in the M-1 zone or on M-2 properties not entirely surrounded by other M-2 zoning; and

WHEREAS, height, area, spacing, electrification, and aesthetic standards have been included in the proposed Zoning Code amendment to ensure any electric fence is designed and located in such a manner to as avoid any adverse effects on public safety and the existing surrounding environment; and

WHEREAS, the certified Environmental Impact Report prepared for the previously adopted General Plan was found to adequately address all environmental impacts associated with the adoption of the proposed Zoning Code amendment; and

WHEREAS, these amendments were analyzed and determined to be within the scope of the General Plan EIR and require no further environmental review under State CEQA Guidelines Section 15162; and

WHEREAS, on November 19, 2012, the City Council held a properly noticed public hearing at which it received a report from City staff, oral and written testimony from the public, and deliberated on the item.

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RANCHO CORDOVA DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Recitals. The foregoing recitals are true and correct and made a part of this Ordinance.

Section 2. Findings. The City Council hereby finds that:

A. **CEQA Compliance.** The Rancho Cordova General Plan FEIR (SCH #2005022137) was certified in June 2006 by the Rancho Cordova City Council. The General Plan EIR is a Program EIR. (CEQA Guidelines section 15168.) The Electric Fence Zoning Code Amendment is an activity within the scope of the General Plan EIR and requires no further environmental review. Further environmental review is not required because the proposed

amendments do not meet the criteria for preparing a subsequent EIR or Negative Declaration under State CEQA Guidelines section 15162. Furthermore, this is a procedural change in the Zoning Code that will not result in a direct, or reasonably foreseeable indirect, physical change in the environment. Therefore, adoption of the Ordinance is not subject to CEQA pursuant to Guidelines Section 15060(c)(2). All applications for Conditional Use Permits under this provision will be required to comply with the requirements of CEQA prior to the approval of the permit.

B. Consistency with the General Plan. The attached Zoning Code Amendment ("Amendment" or "proposed Amendment") is consistent with the General Plan as required by Government Code Section 65454. The Amendment is consistent with and implements the following provisions of the City's adopted General Plan:

General Plan Goals, Policies, and Actions:

- Land Use Action.1.4.4 – Develop guidelines for buffering of incompatible land uses in ways that retain community character but do not consume large land area, create pedestrian barriers, or result in unsafe conditions.

Finding: The proposed Zoning Code Amendment would allow for the installation of electric fences while maintaining the existing community character of the City's industrial core. Any electric fence would be required to uphold certain aesthetic standards and include signage to alert passersby to the presence of electricity within the fence itself and non-electrified perimeter fencing surrounding the installation. This signage and perimeter fencing would eliminate the possible unsafe conditions that could occur from installation of the fence.

Section 3. Amendments. The City Council hereby adopts the amended Section 23.731.80 of the Zoning Code attached in **Exhibit A**.

Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held invalid, the remainder of the Ordinance, including the application of such part or provision to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby and shall continue in full force and effect. To this end, provisions of this Ordinance are severable. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed each section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase hereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, subdivisions, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, or phrases be held unconstitutional, invalid or unenforceable.

Section 5. Effective Date. Within fifteen (15) days after adoption, a Summary of this Ordinance shall be published once in the Grapevine Independent or the Sacramento Bee, a newspaper of general circulation printed and published in Sacramento County and circulated in the City of Rancho Cordova, in accordance with Government Code Section 36933. This Ordinance shall take effect and be enforced thirty (30) days after its adoption.

EXHIBIT A**23.731.080 Special Fencing and Screening Requirements**

- I. **Electric Fencing.** The construction and use of electric fencing shall be allowed in the City only as provided in this section, subject to the following standards:

- a. Location. Electric fences are allowed by right in the M-2 (Heavy Industrial) zone so long as the property on which the fence is to be installed is surrounded, on all sides, by M-2 zoned property. Electric fences are allowed in the M-1 (Light Industrial) zone or M-2 zone when bordered by another zoning district upon issuance of an Administrative Use Permit as defined and regulated in Chapter 23.125 of this Code.

Electric fences are only allowed around non-residential outdoor storage areas or contractor's equipment or storage yard. No electric fence shall be permitted, installed, or used unless it is completely surrounded by a non-electric fence or wall that is at least 6 feet in height.

- b. Height. Electric fences may have a maximum height of 10 feet.
- c. Spacing between fences. The space between an electric fence and perimeter wall or fence may not exceed 12 inches and shall be kept clean and free of litter, debris, and vegetation.
- d. Aesthetics. Electric fences shall be installed as to be as minimally intrusive as possible. Fences should utilize horizontal electrified wires and minimal vertical support beams.

In making the findings for an Administrative Use Permit when one is required, the Planning Director will determine that the proposed electric fence is not detrimental to the aesthetics and continued viability of the surrounding properties. As such, electric fences are likely not compatible if proposed immediately adjacent to an existing retail, restaurant, or other heavily trafficked commercial area unless substantial camouflaging or other design efforts are undertaken to completely shield the electric fence from view.

- e. Electrification. The energizer for electric fences must be driven by a commercial storage battery not to exceed 12 volts DC.

The electric charge produced by the fence upon contact shall not exceed the energizer characteristics set forth in paragraph 22.108 and depicted in Figure 102 of International Electrotechnical Commission (IEC) Standard 60335-2-76.

The fence must also comply with all applicable local and State regulations including being issued a permit by the Building Department.

- f. Warning Signs. Electric fences shall be clearly identified with warning signs that read, at minimum, "Danger – Electric Fence" at an interval of not less than 60 feet and at least one sign per side of the area to be fenced.
- g. Electric fences equipped with monitored alarm systems may require an alarm permit issued by the Rancho Cordova Police Department.

RECOMMENDATION

Adopt Resolution No. 112-2012 authorizing the expenditure plan for the utilization of funds available from the State's Supplemental Law Enforcement Fund (SLESF) which funds the State's "Citizen's Option for Public Safety" (COPS) program.

RESULT OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

This action will result in the preservation of unused prior year grant funds in the amount of \$52,522, and allow for the spending of both the prior year carryover funds and the estimated current year allocation, \$106,280, in accordance with the Government Code 30061.

BACKGROUND

The State of California's budget for FY 2012-13 includes appropriations for the State Supplemental Services Fund for distribution to cities and counties to support jails, criminal prosecutions and front-line law enforcement operations and services. These funds are limited as follows:

- In the cases of cities, these funds must be used exclusively to fund front-line police operations and services in accordance with a written request from the Police Chief.
- For both counties and cities, these funds must supplement existing services and cannot be used to supplant existing funding for current law enforcement services.

The funds appropriated by the State in a given fiscal year are normally expended by local governments in the following fiscal year. Therefore, the State of California's appropriation of COPS funds in fiscal year 2012-13 are available for spending by the City in fiscal year 2013-14.

Government Code Section 30061 mandates that cities develop a plan for the expenditures of SLESF funds and that the City Council approve such expenditures as a separate matter (apart from the normal budget process). The current funding for the City totals \$106,280, provided by the Local Law Enforcement Services Account (LLESA).

The current carryover balance of \$52,522 represents an accumulation of unspent funds from prior years. Funds were unspent for a variety of reasons. During November 2009 through April 2010, the Chief of Police position was vacant; therefore, COPS funds were not used during that time by the interim Acting Police Chief. In the same period, state funding through grants was questionable. Once COPS funding was approved and allocated to cities, by January 2010, spending was still on hold until a new Police Chief was chosen. During fiscal year 2009-10, COPS fund spending was delayed due the move of the police department to a new building as needed equipment, accessories, printed items, or signs were going to be needed but were not yet identified. Spending of the COPS funds resumed during the 2011-12 fiscal year.

The Police Department has requested that these funds be used for “one-time” purchases which are outlined in the attached memo from Rosanne Richeal, included as Exhibit A to the Resolution.

ORDINANCE NO. 20-2012

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RANCHO CORDOVA GRANTING TO THE GOLDEN STATE WATER COMPANY A DETERMINATE FRANCHISE TO CONSTRUCT, MAINTAIN AND USE PIPES AND APPURTENANCES, NECESSARY OR PROPER FOR TRANSMITTING WATER UNDER, ALONG, ACROSS OR UPON THE PUBLIC STREETS WITHIN THE CITY OF RANCHO CORDOVA

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RANCHO CORDOVA DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Definitions. Whenever in this ordinance the words or phrases defined in this section are used, they shall have the respective meanings assigned to them in the following definitions:

(a) "City" means the City of Rancho Cordova, a California municipal corporation, in its present incorporated form or in any later reorganized, consolidated, enlarged or reincorporated form.

(b) "Construct, maintain and use" means to lay, construct, erect, install, operate, maintain, use, repair, modify or replace.

(c) "Day" means a calendar day.

(d) "Grantee" means the Golden State Water Company, a California Corporation, and its lawful successors or assigns.

(e) "Franchise" means the rights and privileges described in this ordinance.

(f) "Pipes and appurtenances" means pipe, pipelines, main, service, trap, vent, vault, manhole, meter, gauge, regulator, valve, conduit, ditch, flume, appliance, attachment, appurtenance and any other property located or to be located in, upon, along, across, under or over the streets of the City, and used or useful in transmitting and distributing water; provided, however, that nothing in this franchise grants the right to use any of the foregoing facilities for any purpose other than the transmission or distribution of water. The term "facilities" may hereafter be used for convenience to refer to "pipes and appurtenances."

(g) "Public streets" means the public streets, ways, alleys and places as they may now or hereafter exist within the city limits of City, including State highways, now or hereafter established within City. "Public streets" includes a public right-of-way, whether or not formally included within City's public road system. "Public streets" does not include a public utility easement crossing private property, nor does "public streets" include any park, playground, school property or other municipal or public property not constituting a public right-of-way. "Public streets" does not include, and this franchise does not allow the use of, a public utility easement described in Government Code Section 50335 or successor legislation, the use of which is governed by such terms and conditions as agreed upon by the parties thereto.

(h) "Term" shall mean the initial term as defined in Section 5(a) and any renewal term, unless otherwise required by the context.

Section 2. Grant of Franchise. City hereby grants Grantee a non-exclusive and determinate franchise to construct, maintain and use pipes and appurtenances necessary or proper for the transmission and distribution of water under, along, across or upon the public streets within those areas of the City located within the Grantee's dedicated areas of service as set forth in the tariff map filed by Grantee with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC). Grantee shall provide City with notice of any filing with the CPUC for a change in service area located within the boundaries of the City and all tariff maps filed by Grantee with the CPUC reflecting the service area of Grantee within the City, unless waived in writing by the Public Works Director.

Section 3. Compliance with Local Laws.

(a) Grantee shall construct, maintain and use all pipes and appurtenances in a good and workmanlike manner and in compliance with all lawful federal, State and City laws, ordinances, resolutions, regulations, policies, rules, orders, plans and specifications in force at the time this franchise becomes effective or as may be amended or added from time to time during the term of this franchise.

(b) All zoning, uniform code, business license, fee, or other generally applicable ordinances now existing, or enacted by the City Council in the future, are, to the extent lawful, fully applicable to Grantee, and the Grantee agrees to fully comply with these existing and future generally applicable lawful ordinances. The Grantee agrees that the City requiring the Grantee to comply with future generally applicable lawful ordinances, will not result, in any circumstances, in a substantial impairment of the Grantee's rights under this franchise. If there is a conflict between this franchise and any generally applicable lawful ordinance, the generally applicable lawful ordinance will prevail. If the City requires the Grantee to comply with a future generally applicable lawful ordinance that the Grantee determines will materially increase the Grantee's operations costs, the Grantee may request that the City approve a longer franchise term.

(c) Upon constructing, maintaining or using any pipes and appurtenances, or any part thereof, Grantee shall expeditiously at its own cost and expense restore all public property disturbed or altered as a result of Grantee's actions to the condition that the public property was in prior to being disturbed or altered as reasonably determined by the City. As used in this section, "public property" means public streets, rights-of-way and improvements and includes, but is not limited to, all public improvements associated with the public streets that may be affected by Grantee's activities, such as landscaping, irrigation systems, street lights, street furniture, sidewalks and bus shelters. Grantee shall comply with City's terms and conditions concerning the location within the public streets of proposed facilities, except to the extent State or federal law or regulation preempts any such terms and conditions.

(d) Grantee's activities and each restoration of public property under this franchise shall be performed in a good and workmanlike manner, and in accordance with the lawful standard plans, specifications, orders, rules and regulations of City and each of its applicable departments, and subject to all lawful fees and exactions.

Section 4. Relocation. Grantee shall remove or relocate, without expense to City and within the time City reasonably specifies, any facilities installed, used and maintained under this franchise, if and when made necessary by any lawful change of grade, alignment

or width of any public street, way, alley, or place, including the construction of any subway or viaduct, by City.

Section 5. Term.

(a) The initial term of the franchise shall commence with the effective date of this franchise as certified under Section 21 and continue for a period of fifteen (15) years ("Initial Term"), subject to renewal and termination as provided under this section. The aggregate term of the franchise, including the Initial Term and the renewal term, shall not exceed thirty (30) years.

(b) At the conclusion of the Initial Term and upon application by Grantee, the term of the franchise may be renewed for an additional fifteen (15) year period ("Renewal Term"). An application for renewal shall be filed with the City Clerk at least six (6) months before the expiration date of the current term. Such application shall be subject to the approval of the City Council after a public hearing. Notice of the hearing shall be published at least fifteen (15) days prior to the hearing in a newspaper of general circulation within City or posted in the places designated for posting of official notices. The City Council shall approve the application unless it finds, on the basis of substantial evidence, that Grantee is then in material violation of this franchise. In approving the application, the City Council may modify the franchise by ordinance based upon the experience of City in administering the franchise during the preceding term and to take into account changes in relevant technology and utility industry regulatory developments and business practices. Any modification of the franchise shall be based upon substantial evidence concerning the need for such modification in the record considered by the City Council. Grantee shall reimburse City for all reasonable costs, staff time, legal and consulting fees incurred by City, in connection with processing the application, up to a maximum of \$5,000. Such payment shall be made within thirty (30) days after City shall have completed proceedings on the application and furnished Grantee with a written statement of such expenses. A renewal, including any modifications to the franchise ordinance, shall not be effective, unless Grantee accepts such renewal pursuant to Public Utilities Code Section 6235.

(c) During the term of the franchise, the franchise shall remain in full force and effect unless: (1) Grantee voluntarily surrenders or abandons the franchise, with the consent of the applicable State or federal regulatory agency; (2) the State or some municipal or public corporation purchases by voluntary agreement or condemns and takes under the power of eminent domain, all property actually used and useful in the exercise of the franchise and situate within the territorial limits of the State, municipal or public corporation purchasing or condemning such property, or (3) the franchise is forfeited for noncompliance with its terms by Grantee.

Section 6. Franchise Payment. Grantee shall pay the franchise payments set forth in this section.

(a) During the term of this franchise, Grantee shall pay City two percent (2%) of Grantee's gross annual receipts arising from the use, operation or possession of the franchise, except that this payment shall be not less than one percent (1%) of Grantee's gross annual receipts derived from the sale within City limits of the utility service for which the franchise is awarded.

(b) Gross annual receipts shall include Grantee's receipts from the transmission

and distribution of water, and from the sale of any service or use of facilities, which involves Grantee's use, operation or possession of the franchise.

(c) In the event the legislature amends the Franchise Act of 1937 or enacts any other state law which increases the franchise payment to general law cities to a level greater than that provided in Section 6(a)-(b), then the City shall have the option of prospectively employing the new legislative formula, which shall apply for the remaining term of this Franchise. If the City exercises this option, the legislative formula shall be prospectively applied hereto on the later of (i) the effective date of the legislation, or (ii) January 1 of the calendar year in which the City exercised this option.

(d) The franchise payment under this section constitutes payment for the privilege of using public streets, and is not in derogation of any other lawful fee or exaction. Nothing in this ordinance shall limit or otherwise affect any ability City may have to require franchisees making use of public streets to pay for and obtain encroachment permit fees and pay trench cut fees, as applicable. In no event may any such fees or exactions charged by the City in connection with obtaining any such permit or trench cut fees exceed the reasonable costs to the City in processing the permit application, or otherwise be unreasonable or discriminatory.

Section 7. Payment; Audit.

(a) Within three (3) months after the expiration of each calendar year, or fractional calendar year, following the effective date of this franchise as certified under Section 21, Grantee shall file with City's Finance Director or other official designated by City a verified statement under penalty of perjury showing in detail the total gross receipts of Grantee during the preceding calendar year, or fractional calendar year. Grantee's statement shall include such other data or information as City may need to calculate or determine the amounts which Grantee is obligated to pay City pursuant to the provisions of Section 6.

(b) Within fifteen (15) days after filing the statement required by Section 7(a), Grantee shall pay to City, in lawful money of the United States, the amount required by Section 6 for such calendar year or fractional calendar year.

(c) Annually, at Grantee's expense, the City shall have the right to audit the books and records of Grantee relating to the calculation of the franchise fee upon reasonable notice during normal business hours solely for the purpose of verifying the calculation of the franchise fee. City shall, to the extent permitted by applicable law, maintain the confidentiality of all information provided by Grantee to City in connection with such audit that Grantee has informed City is confidential. Nothing herein shall be construed to require Grantee to make available information which constitutes private or confidential information pertaining to specific customers of Grantee, without the prior written consent of such customers. All books and records of Grantee relating to the calculation of the franchise fee for any calendar year shall be maintained by Grantee for a period of at least four (4) years following the delivery of the certified statement for such year.

(d) Any neglect, omission or refusal by Grantee to file the verified statement, or to remit its payment as specified in this section and in the amount set forth in Section 6 shall be grounds for declaration of a forfeiture of this franchise and of all rights of Grantee hereunder, consistent with Public Utilities Code Section 6291.

Section 8. Authority. This franchise is granted under the Franchise Act of 1937.

Section 9. Indemnity; Liability.

(a) Grantee shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless City, its officers and employees from all liability for damages proximately resulting from any operations under the franchise. In addition, Grantee shall be liable to City for all damages proximately resulting from the failure of Grantee well and faithfully to observe and perform any lawful provision of the franchise and any provision of any applicable law under which this franchise is granted.

(b) In addition to the provisions of Section 9(a), Grantee shall specifically indemnify, defend and hold harmless City, its officers and employees from any claim, suit or action arising from the presence of any hazardous materials in a public street and proximately resulting from Grantee's operations under the franchise. As used in this section, 'hazardous materials' means any hazardous substances, materials or wastes (1) defined or listed as "hazardous substances," "toxic substances" or similarly identified under any provision of California law; (2) designated as "hazardous substances" under the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (42 U.S.C. Sections 9601, *et seq.*), the Federal Hazardous Materials Transportation Law (49 U.S.C. Sections 5101, *et seq.*), the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (42 U.S.C. Sections 6901, *et seq.*), or the Toxic Substance Control Act of 1976 (15 U.S.C. Sections 2601, *et seq.*); (3) defined as "toxic pollutants" under the Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. Sections 1251, *et seq.*); (4) designated as "hazardous air pollutants" under the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. Sections 7401, *et seq.*); or (5) defined, designated or listed under any State or federal legislation or regulations adopted or amended during the term hereof. However, nothing in this section shall be interpreted in a way that would preclude Grantee from asserting defenses liability claims afforded public utilities regulated by the California Public Utilities Commission under California law (including court interpretations of California laws, such as *Hartwell Corp. v Superior Court* (2002) 27 Cal. 4th 256).

Section 10. Payment of Cost of Repairs. Grantee shall pay to City on demand the cost incurred by City for all repairs to public property made necessary by any of Grantee's operations under this franchise.

Section 11. Performance Bond or Letter of Credit.

(a) Grantee shall file with the City Clerk a corporate surety bond running to City and approved by the City Council, in a penal sum of \$15,000 (fifteen thousand dollars), which sum was set forth in the resolution of intention to grant this franchise. The bond shall be conditioned that Grantee shall well and truly observe, fulfill and perform each lawful term and condition of the franchise, and that in case of any material breach of condition of the bond the amount of the penal sum therein shall be recoverable. Grantee shall file such bond within five (5) days after the effective date of this ordinance. If the bond is not so filed, or is not approved by the City Council, the franchise may be refused or forfeited and any money paid to City in connection therewith shall be retained by City.

(b) Grantee shall maintain the bond in full force and effect throughout the Term of this franchise, at Grantee's sole expense. The bond shall be issued by an admitted surety insurer and comply with the requirements of the Bond and Undertaking Law, codified in Code of Civil Procedure Sections 995.010 *et seq.* This franchise shall be considered a "license or permit" within the meaning of the Bond and Undertaking Law, solely for purposes of application of such law to the bonding requirements of this section.

(c) Grantee may at its sole election provide an irrevocable standby letter of credit, in a form acceptable to the City Attorney, securing all or a portion of the amount otherwise required to be secured by the performance bond. The letter of credit shall be issued by an issuing bank with offices in California, or shall authorize an advising bank with offices in California to pay the beneficiary thereunder. The letter of credit shall authorize City to draw upon its proceeds in the event that Grantee fails to well and truly observe, fulfill and perform each lawful term and condition of the franchise, and that in case of any material breach of the franchise City may draw against the letter of credit up to the total amount set forth therein. If Grantee determines to file a letter of credit, Grantee shall file such letter of credit within five (5) days after the effective date of this ordinance.

Section 12. Publication Expenses. Grantee shall pay City a sum of money sufficient to reimburse City for all publication expenses incurred by it in connection with the granting of this franchise. Such payment shall be made within thirty (30) days after City shall have furnished Grantee with a written statement of such expenses. City shall furnish such written statement within thirty (30) days after this ordinance becomes effective.

Section 13. Other City Expenses. Grantee shall pay City a sum of money sufficient to reimburse City for all City staff time, legal and consulting fees reasonably incurred by City, in connection with the review and granting of this franchise, up to a maximum of \$5,000. Such payment shall be made within thirty (30) days after City shall have furnished Grantee with a written statement of such expenses. City shall furnish such written statement within thirty (30) days after this ordinance becomes effective.

Section 14. Insurance. During the term of this franchise, Grantee shall obtain and maintain at its sole cost and expense the insurance coverage required by this section.

(a) Grantee shall obtain and maintain commercial general liability insurance coverage for an aggregate annual amount of three million dollars (\$3,000,000), including bodily injury, personal injury and property damage or its equivalent in coverage, upon approval by the City. Such insurance coverage shall include, without limitation: (1) contractual liability coverage adequate to meet Grantee's indemnification obligations under Section 9; and (2) a cross-liability clause. Additionally, the insurance coverage shall contain the following endorsements as a part of each policy: (1) City is added as an additional insured for Grantee's operations under the franchise; and (2) the insurance shall cover the negligent acts of Grantee and the negligent acts of its employees, agents and subcontractors in the performance of work under the franchise.

(b) The insurance coverage required by this section may be satisfied by any combination of specific liability and excess liability policies, or by a self-insurance program reasonably satisfactory to City.

(c) The insurance coverage shall be primary and no insurance held by City shall be called to contribute to a loss under this coverage.

(d) Grantee shall submit proof of insurance to the City Clerk as set forth in Section 21, and shall thereafter file additional such proof annually.

Section 15. Police Power. Nothing in this franchise shall limit or otherwise affect the police power of City, as such authority may affect Grantee.

Section 16. Acquisition of Grantee's Property. The franchise granted hereunder in no way impairs or affects the right of City to acquire the property of Grantee by purchase or condemnation, and nothing in this ordinance shall be constructed to contract away, modify or abridge either for a term or in perpetuity City's right of eminent domain in respect to any public utility.

Section 17. Valuation of Franchise. This franchise shall never be given any value before any court or other public authority in any proceeding of any character in excess of the cost to Grantee of the necessary publication under Section 12 and any other sum paid by Grantee to City under Section 13 at the time of acquisition.

Section 18. Transfer of Franchise. The Grantee shall file with the City Public Works Department within thirty (30) days after any sale, transfer, assignment or lease of the franchise or any part hereto, or any of the rights or privileges granted hereby, written evidence of the transaction certified by the Grantee or its duly authorized officers.

Section 19. Resolution, Notice of Hearing and Protests. On November 5, 2012 the City Council adopted Resolution No. 105-2012 stating its intent to grant this franchise. Notice of hearing was given in the manner required by law. The City Council has held a duly noticed public hearing on its intention to grant this franchise. The City Council has heard any and all protests, and hereby determines such protests to be insufficient, overruled or denied.

Section 20. Construction. Headings in this ordinance are for convenience only, and shall have no bearing on interpreting the provisions hereof. If any provision of this ordinance is held by a court to be void or unenforceable, the same shall in no way affect any other provision of this ordinance, the application of any such provision in another circumstance, or the validity or enforceability of this ordinance as a whole. In the event any provision of this ordinance is held by a court to be void or unenforceable, City shall have the opportunity to amend this ordinance in a manner consistent with the judgment with the consent of Grantee or to negotiate a new franchise with Grantee.

Section 21. Franchise Effective Date. The franchise granted hereby shall not become effective until each of the following conditions is satisfied: (1) Grantee files written acceptance thereof with the City Clerk, which shall occur no later than one hundred and twenty (120) days after the effective date of this ordinance or this ordinance shall be of no further force or effect. (2) Grantee pays all sums owed to City under Sections 12 and 13. (3) Grantee files with the City Clerk either a bond as provided for in Section 11(a) or a letter of credit as provided in Section 11(c), and proof of insurance as required by Section 14. Upon receipt of the required documentation, the City Clerk shall certify the effective date of the franchise and notify Grantee thereof. Upon becoming effective, the water franchise granted hereunder shall supersede any previous water franchise issued to Grantee for service areas within the City of Rancho Cordova.

Section 22. Enforcement.

(a) If Grantee fails, neglects or refuses to comply with any of the provisions or conditions prescribed in this ordinance in any material respect, and does not within ten (10) days after receipt of a written demand for compliance begin the work of compliance, or after such beginning does not prosecute the work with due diligence to completion, City through

its City Council may declare the franchise forfeited, or assess damages as provided in this section for unexcused violations of the franchise.

(b) To implement enforcement under this section, City shall proceed as follows.

1. Notice of demand for compliance shall be in writing signed by the City Manager or designee and delivered by personal delivery or certified mail to that person identified in Section 26. The notice shall demand correction within a reasonable time. Such time shall not be less than ten (10) days after receipt of the notice. If Grantee is shown to have violated the franchise, or to have failed to correct the violation within the time prescribed, or if Grantee fails to commence corrective action within the time prescribed and diligently remedy such violation thereafter, or if the violation is not correctable, then City shall give Grantee written notice of not less than ten (10) days of a public hearing to be held before the City Council. City shall also give public notice of the hearing. The notice shall specify the alleged violations.

2. At the public hearing, the Council shall hear and consider all relevant evidence, and thereafter render written findings and its written decision. The hearing shall provide Grantee with the full opportunity to participate and present evidence.

3. If the Council finds that no material violation exists, or that Grantee has corrected the violation, or has diligently commenced correction of such violation after notice thereof from City and is diligently proceeding to fully remedy such violation, the proceedings shall terminate and no penalty or other sanction shall be imposed. In determining whether a violation is material, City shall take into consideration the reliability of the evidence of the violation, the nature of the violation and the damage (if any) caused to City thereby, whether the violation was chronic, and any aggravating or mitigating circumstances and such other matters as City may deem appropriate. In the event a proceeding is terminated, and City subsequently finds that the violation has not been corrected, City may, without prejudice, reinstate the proceeding.

4. If the Council finds that a material violation exists and that Grantee has not corrected the same in a satisfactory manner or has not diligently commenced correction of such violation, the Council may declare the franchise forfeited; or require payment of a dollar amount of compensatory damages resulting from Grantee's material violation; or declare the franchise forfeited and require payment of such compensatory damages. If Grantee fails to pay any sum due under this section within ten (10) days after invoice, City may require payment under the performance bond or letter of credit provided for in Section 11.

5. If the Council finds that a material violation exists, Grantee shall have the right to seek review of the Council's decision in the Superior Court of the State of California. The Council's decision shall not be stayed pending such review, absent a contrary order of the Court.

6. The remedies set forth in this section are cumulative, and are in addition to all other rights and remedies, including injunctive relief, available to City.

Section 23. Jurisdiction and Venue. Any dispute that arises under or relates to this franchise shall be resolved in the Superior Court of the State of California, and venue shall

be proper in the county in which City is located. In any such litigation, Grantee and City shall each be responsible for its respective attorneys' fees and costs.

Section 24. Notices. All notices, demands or statements required by this franchise to Grantee shall be in writing and delivered by hand or certified mail addressed to:

All notices required by this franchise to City shall be in writing and delivered by hand or certified mail addressed to the City Clerk. All notices shall be deemed given on the date of delivery by hand, or three days after deposit in the mail, postage prepaid.

Section 25. Effective Date and Publication. Within fifteen (15) days from and after adoption, this Ordinance shall be published once in the Grapevine Independent, a newspaper of general circulation printed and published in Sacramento County and circulated in the City of Rancho Cordova, in accordance with California Government Code Section 36933. This Ordinance shall take effect and be enforced thirty (30) days after its adoption.

SUBJECT: **AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 16.20 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, TITLED "HOUSING CODE," REGARDING FEES LEVIED AGAINST RENTAL PROPERTY OWNERS FOR INSPECTIONS AND CODE VIOLATIONS; AND A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE RELEVANT FEE SCHEDULE**

RECOMMENDATION

Waive the first reading and introduce Ordinance No. 19-2012

RESULT OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Adoption of Ordinance No. 19-2012 would amend Chapter 16.20, "Housing Code," of the Rancho Cordova Municipal Code to allow rental property owners to pay lower fees if they quickly correct minor code violations discovered during an inspection. Adoption of this Ordinance also amends the code to reflect a recent court decisions regarding consent to enter a rental property and the authority to charge inspection fees.

BACKGROUND

Fees Related to Rental Property Reinspections

Rental property owners must pay the City an annual, per unit Rental Housing Code Compliance fee. The fee is set annually by the City Manager. It is currently \$10 per rental dwelling unit. The fees fund periodic inspections of rental properties to ensure they meet building standards and all state and local codes.

During these inspections, if violations are found (including minor violations such as a missing light bulb), the property owner is issued a notice and order. The City then conducts a "reinspection" to determine if the violation has been corrected. The City's Housing Code currently requires that upon reinspection, the property owner must pay a \$253.00 "reinspection fee." This fee is levied regardless of whether the violation has been corrected. Subsequent reinspections to check on any continuing violations found at the first reinspection currently come with a \$510.00 "notice and order" fee. The code also calls for a "closing fee" of \$253.00 for each notice and order.

Under this fee structure, a landlord who corrects a minor violation prior to the first reinspection can be assessed \$506.00 (\$253.00 for the reinspection following the notice and order, and another \$253.00 for the closing fee). A landlord who does not correct the violation by the first reinspection, but does correct it by the second reinspection, is charged \$1,016.00 (\$253.00 for the first reinspection, \$510.00 for the second reinspection/notice and order fee, and \$253.00 for the closing fee.)

In recent years, Neighborhood Services has worked diligently to eradicate blight and Housing Code violations caused by rental property owners who were “repeat offenders.” The current fee structure successfully motivated such landlords to either rehabilitate their properties or sell them. It also reflected the large amount of staff time spent processing and following up on inspections that resulted in excessive violations. Many properties with serious deferred maintenance problems went into receivership and the new owners have rehabilitated them. Deferred maintenance is now less of a problem among the City’s rental property owners. The result is safer and more attractive rental properties, which also improve the quality of the surrounding neighborhood.

Additionally, most of the City’s large complexes with many units have been rehabilitated. The code enforcement team is now focused on smaller properties, such as single family homes and duplexes.

The local rental housing association has requested that the City consider adjusting its rental inspection fee structure so that property owners who act quickly to correct code violations are not penalized. Neighboring jurisdictions, including the City of Sacramento and Sacramento County, have such fee structures.

If adopted, Ordinance No. 19-2012 and Resolution No. 111-2012 would change the fee structure regarding rental housing inspections. There would be no fee associated with the first reinspection. Yet if the violation has not been corrected, then the property owner will face another reinspection. Based on this reinspection, the City will charge the property owner a \$510.00 fee for the first uncorrected violation discovered. For each additional uncorrected violation, the property owner will be charged an hourly rate for the inspector’s time (with a minimum ½-hour charge).

Each time the City is required to reinspect the property to ensure a violation has been corrected, the owner may be charged the \$510.00 fee for the first uncorrected violation and the hourly rate for additional uncorrected violations. The Ordinance would also repeal the \$253.00 closing fee associated with each notice of violation. City staff feels this amended fee schedule more accurately reflects the cost of providing services related to the rental housing inspection program, in light of the changes in the City’s rental housing stock.

Consent and Inspections of Rental Housing

If adopted, Ordinance No. 19-2012 would amend the wording of RCMC 16.20.1200 to clarify the procedures surrounding entry into a rental unit for an inspection. The change makes it clear that the City must have consent from either the owner or occupant of the property (the code currently states “consent” and does not specify from whom). This Ordinance would also add the words “good faith” to clarify the type of effort a landlord must make when attempting to get permission from the unit’s occupant for the City to enter for an inspection. These two changes bring the code in line with a recent California Court of Appeal decision regarding consent to enter rental properties for inspections by City officials.

ORDINANCE NO. 19-2012

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL AMENDING CHAPTER 16.20 TITLE 16 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, TITLED “HOUSING CODE,” REGARDING FEES LEVIED AGAINST RENTAL PROPERTY OWNERS FOR REINSPECTIONS PERTAINING TO CODE VIOLATIONS AND REGARDING PERIODIC INSPECTIONS PROCEDURE

RECITALS

Whereas, Title 16, Chapter 16.20 of the Rancho Cordova Municipal Code, entitled “Housing Code,” sets forth policies and regulations to promote minimum standards for safe, healthy rental housing conditions within the City to enhance the quality of life for all residents; and

Whereas, substandard and unsafe residential rental dwellings within Rancho Cordova threaten the health, safety, and welfare of residents of such dwellings; and

Whereas, substandard and unsafe residential rental dwellings have a negative effect on the surrounding community because they are a blight and often are associated with or encourage unlawful activity; and

Whereas, Rancho Cordova code enforcement staff has observed, in performing their duties, that generally the most egregious violations of health, safety, and building codes occur in rental housing units; and

Whereas, performing annual inspections of all residential dwellings within Rancho Cordova would be overly burdensome on City staff and homeowners; and

Whereas, the most efficient and effective method of detecting unhealthy, dangerous, substandard, and unsanitary housing conditions is to routinely inspect rental housing units in a fair manner while observing the occupants’ right to privacy; and

Whereas, the California Health and Safety Code, Sections 17964, and 17970-17972 grant cities the authority to inspect rental housing dwellings; and

Whereas, City staff has identified the following necessary amendments to the Housing Code to ensure compliance and a fair process which will promote public health, safety, and welfare.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RANCHO CORDOVA DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Amendment of Code. Section 16.20.015(B), entitled “Findings,” is hereby amended to read as follows:

B. Complaint-initiated enforcement actions combined with routine residential rental property inspections are necessary to provide the essential level of abatement of substandard housing conditions within Rancho Cordova to promote public health, safety, and welfare. City staff has

observed, in performing their duties, that generally the most egregious violations of health, safety, and building codes occur in rental housing units and therefore it is most efficient and effective to require periodic inspections of residential rental units rather than all housing units in the city.

Section 2. Amendment of Code. Section 16.20.221, entitled “Fees,” shall be added to the Rancho Cordova Municipal Code and read as follows:

16.20.221 Fees.

Unless a fee amount is specifically provided within this title, the City Council shall from time to time establish fees for services provided under this title by resolution, and where appropriate grant the City Manager the authority to review and adjust such fees when necessary to cover the cost of enforcement of this chapter.

Section 3. Amendment of Code. The title portion of Article XI, titled “Rental Housing Enforcement Fees,” shall be amended to read as follows:

Article XI. Rental Housing Enforcement Fees*

*The following sections constitute the categories of fees payable to the director by the owner of a building or residential rental unit subject to the Rental Housing Inspection Program within Article XII of this chapter. Such fees shall be set by resolution of the City Council and may be adjusted periodically by the City Manager to cover the cost of the services provided under this chapter.

Section 4. Amendment of Code. Section 16.20.1100 of the Rancho Cordova Municipal Code entitled, “Reinspection Fee,” is hereby amended to read as follows:

A. Following issuance of a notice and order (pursuant to RCMC 16.20.400) for a violation of the provisions of this chapter, upon the first reinspection of a dwelling to determine whether corrective action has been satisfactorily completed, and upon a determination that corrective action has been successfully completed by the time of such reinspection, there shall be no fee levied against the owner(s). There shall be no reinspection fee charged for an inspection caused by any complaint if no violation is discovered.

B. Following issuance of a notice and order (pursuant to RCMC 16.20.400) for a violation of the provisions of this chapter, upon the first reinspection of a dwelling to determine whether corrective action has been satisfactorily completed, and upon a determination that corrective action has not been successfully completed by the time of such reinspection, there may be a fee levied against the owner(s) in the amount set by resolution of the City Council.

C. Upon all subsequent reinspections, fees shall be levied against dwelling unit owners for previously noticed violations which have not been corrected by the time of such subsequent reinspections. Such fees shall be set by resolution of the City Council.

Section 5. Repeal Code. Section 16.20.1105 of the Rancho Cordova Municipal Code entitled, “Notice and Order Fee,” is hereby repealed.

Section 6. Amendment of Code. Section 16.20.1115 of the Rancho Cordova Municipal Code entitled, “Building permit surcharge,” is hereby amended to read as follows:

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Where a building permit is required under the building code to complete work required by a notice and order issued under this chapter, there shall be imposed in addition to the building permit fee a building permit surcharge in the amount set by resolution of the City Council.

Section 7. Amendment of Code. Section 16.20.1120 of the Rancho Cordova Municipal Code entitled, "Hourly rate," is hereby amended to read as follows:

Where the director finds that additional costs of enforcement are not otherwise recovered by the fees levied by this chapter in association with a dwelling found to constitute a violation, the additional costs of enforcement shall be levied at the hourly rate to be set by resolution of the City Council, rounded to the nearest hour for each city official involved. Such hourly rate may also be applied to fees under RCMC 16.20.1100, where there is more than one uncorrected violation found.

Section 8. Amendment of Code. Section 16.20.1130 of the Rancho Cordova Municipal Code entitled, "Small claims collection fee," is hereby amended to read as follows:

For any amounts due and unpaid, and which are referred to the finance department for collection under this chapter, a fee set by resolution of the City Council shall be levied to cover costs of small claims court filing and administration.

Section 9. Amendment of Code. Section 16.20.1135 of the Rancho Cordova Municipal Code entitled, "Appeal fee," is hereby amended to read as follows:

The fee for all appeals taken under this chapter shall be set by resolution of the City Council.

Section 10. Repeal Code. Section 16.20.1150 of the Rancho Cordova Municipal Code entitled, "Closing fee," is hereby repealed.

Section 11 . Amendment of Code. Section 16.20.1200(A) of the Rancho Cordova Municipal Code entitled, "'Periodic Inspections," is hereby amended to read as follows:

A. The director and his or her designees may periodically inspect residential rental property in the city. Entry for inspection shall be as the result of consent from the owner or occupant, or as the result of a warrant, pursuant to RCMC 16.20.1205.

Section 12. Amendment of Code. Section 16.20.1205 of the Rancho Cordova Municipal Code entitled, "Notice of inspections – Inspection procedure," is hereby amended to read as follows:

A. A letter of intent to inspect a residential rental property shall be mailed to the rental owner or his or her designee stating the date and time of inspection. Additionally, a notice will be posted on the property by the city. Such notification shall give a minimum of 14 days' notice and include a description of areas that will be inspected. The property may be inspected at an earlier date than noticed, upon the consent of the rental owner or his or her designee and contingent upon consent of any legal occupant or tenant.

B. Owners shall provide access to all required areas of the rental property for inspection within the time period specified in the notice of inspection. If the rental unit is legally occupied by a tenant or other occupant, the owner shall notify the tenant or occupant and request that the tenant or occupant allow entry into the unit by the city for the inspection. It shall be the

responsibility of the owner to notify the individual tenants of the inspection and make every good-faith effort to facilitate access to the property to be inspected.

C. In the event the owner, his or her designee, or tenant or occupant in possession of the property to be inspected refuses access to the property, the inspector shall have recourse to every remedy provided by law to secure lawful entry and inspect the premises, including but not limited to securing an inspection warrant pursuant to California Code of Civil Procedure Sections 1822.50 through 1822.57. The inspector shall provide notice that a warrant has been issued to both the owner/operator and the tenant or occupant at least twenty-four hours before the warrant is executed, unless the judge finds that immediate execution is reasonably necessary under the circumstances shown.

D. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the inspector has reasonable cause to believe that the residential rental dwelling unit is so hazardous, unsafe or dangerous as to require immediate inspection to safeguard the public health or safety, the inspector shall have the right to immediately enter and inspect the premises and may use any reasonable means required to effect the entry and make an inspection.

E. Should an inspection need to be canceled or rescheduled, the rental owner or his or her designee shall be notified at least 24 hours prior to the scheduled inspection date. It shall be the responsibility of the rental owner to notify any tenants or occupants of a cancellation.

F. Formal Notice and Order. A formal report of the inspection results shall be mailed to the rental owner or his or her designee within 10 days of the completion of an inspection. The formal report shall include the results of the inspection. If violations are present, the director or his or her designee shall also mail and post a formal notice and order, pursuant to RCMC 16.20.400, indicating the violations, proper remedy for violations, the scheduled reinspection date and time, and any reinspection fees and costs that have been assessed.

G. Report of inspection. Rental owners shall provide the formal report of the inspection results specified in subsection (F) of this section to tenants or occupants upon the request of tenants or occupants.

H. New violations. Violations that were not noted on the initial inspection report but are discovered during the reinspection due to subsequent damage or deterioration shall be subject to correction.

Section 13. Severability

If any provision of this ordinance, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held invalid, the remainder of the ordinance, including the application of such part or provision to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby and shall continue in full force and effect. To this end, provisions of this ordinance are severable. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed each section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase hereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, subdivisions, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, or phrases be held unconstitutional, invalid or unenforceable.

Section 14. Effective Date

Within fifteen (15) days after adoption, a Summary of this Ordinance shall be published once in the Grapevine Independent or the Sacramento Bee, a newspaper of general circulation printed

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RANCHO CORDOVA
AMENDING THE FEE SCHEDULE FOR SERVICES PROVIDED PURSUANT
TO TITLE 16, CHAPTER 16.20 OF THE RANCHO CORDOVA MUNICIPAL CODE,
TITLED "HOUSING CODE"**

WHEREAS, the City of Rancho Cordova incurs significant costs associated with the enforcement of its Housing Code to promote the public health, safety, and welfare by eliminating unsafe, unsanitary, and substandard housing; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Government Code Section 50076, the City may impose fees that do not exceed the reasonable cost of providing the service or regulatory activity for which the fees are charged and which are not levied for general revenue purposes and are not special taxes as defined in Article 3.5 of the Government Code; and

WHEREAS, Section 16.20.221 of the Rancho Cordova Municipal Code grants City Council the authority to set fees related to Chapter 16.20 of the Rancho Cordova Municipal Code by resolution; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Rancho Cordova desires to revise the schedule of fees charged for services provided pursuant to the rental housing inspection program to better match enforcement needs; and

WHEREAS, notice of the public hearing at which this Resolution was adopted was given by publication ten (10) days in advance in accordance with Section 6062a of the Government Code; and;

WHEREAS, the City Council conducted a public hearing prior to adopting this Resolution revising the fees related to the administration of the rental housing inspection program and considered written and oral communications received during said public hearing; and

WHEREAS, the schedule of fees and the total amounts thereof, described in **Exhibit "A"** attached, are hereby determined to be reasonable in that the amounts thereof do not exceed the estimated reasonable costs of inspection and reinspection of residential rental dwellings, enforcement of the Housing Code, and administrative costs associated with such services; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED by the City Council of the City of Rancho Cordova as follows:

Section 1. Findings. The following findings are true and correct and adopted as the findings of the City Council:

A. The purpose of the fees set forth in **Exhibit "A"** of this Resolution are to recover up to the full, lawfully recoverable costs incurred by the City in providing and administering the rental housing inspection program, and such fees are not levied for general revenue purposes.

ATTACHMENT 2

B. After consideration of the data and information regarding the costs of processing complaints, carrying out inspections and reinspections, and administering notices and orders related to code violations subject to this Resolution, all testimony received orally or in writing at or before the noticed public hearing, the agenda report and the background documents to the agenda report, the City Council of the City of Rancho Cordova approves and adopts such data and information, and finds that the costs listed for those fees which are to be updated and/or established as costs incurred by the City in carrying out the rental housing inspection program are reasonable estimates of the cost of providing such services, and that the revisions recommended to existing fees for such services are necessary to recover the reasonable, estimated cost of providing such services.

C. Adoption of the fees set forth in **Exhibit "A"** of this Resolution are not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") pursuant to 14 California Code of Regulations ("CEQA Guidelines") section 15378(b)(4) and/or CEQA Guidelines section 15061(b)(3).

Section 2. Fee Schedule Adoption: The schedule of fees set forth in **Exhibit "A"** of this Resolution, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, are hereby directed to be charged and applied by the various City departments, and to be collected by the City for the herein listed services related to the rental housing inspection program.

Section 3. City Manager Authority: The City Manager is authorized to review the fees imposed by this resolution and adjust the fees to reflect the actual costs of providing the services as required by State law. This review shall happen at least every 12 months.

Section 4. Use of Fees Revenue: The revenues raised by payment of the fees and charges established by this Resolution shall be used to fund the estimated reasonable cost of providing the services for which the fees are charged, and the revenues from such fees and charges shall not be used for general revenue purposes.

Section 5. Repealer. These fees shall supersede the corresponding fees previously established by the City. All previously adopted and conflicting fees and all Ordinances Resolutions and other actions of the City Council containing conflicting fees are hereby repealed to the extent they conflict with the contents of this Resolution.

2. The building permit surcharge, pursuant to Section 16.20.1115 of the Rancho Cordova Municipal Code, shall be \$78.00.
3. The hourly rate for City staff time, pursuant to Sections 16.20.1120 and 16.20.1120 of the Rancho Cordova Municipal Code, shall be \$253.00 per hour.
4. The small claims collection fee, pursuant to Section 16.20.1130 of the Rancho Cordova Municipal Code, shall be \$150.00.
5. The appeal fee, pursuant to Section 16.20.1135 of the Rancho Cordova Municipal Code, shall be \$150.00.

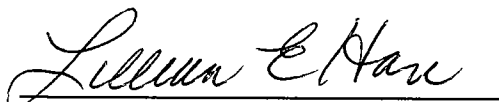

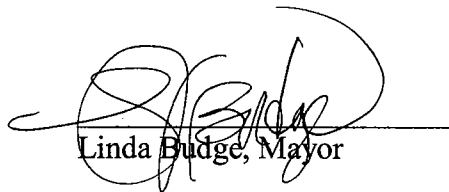
