SUBJECT: **UPDATE ON GROWING STRONG NEIGHBORHOODS (GSN) AND PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE RANCHO CORDOVA MUNICIPAL CODE**

RECOMMENDATION

Receive information and provide direction.

RESULT OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Based on Council direction, the Growing Strong Neighborhoods (GSN) team will come back to a future Council meeting with proposed amendments to the municipal code.

BACKGROUND

The City of Rancho Cordova has made significant investments in programs and services that promote safe, attractive, and thriving neighborhoods. Over the past several years, the City of Rancho Cordova has expanded its proactive approach to neighborhood preservation by implementing programs that emphasize early intervention, community engagement, education, and consistent enforcement. Collectively, these efforts support the city's vision of maintaining high-quality neighborhoods while protecting public health, safety, and the overall quality of life for residents.

This work session will provide the City Council with a comprehensive update on the city's Growing Strong Neighborhoods initiative and the programs that support that mission. Staff will provide updates on several key service areas, including the Proactive Neighborhood Engagement Program, Proactive Rental Housing Inspection Program, Homeless Outreach Team (HOT), Parking Enforcement Program, Abandoned Vehicle Abatement Program, Weed Abatement Program, Business License Enforcement Program, Illegal Firework Enforcement Program, Animal Services, Community Engagement and various grant opportunities. The presentation will highlight recent accomplishments, performance measures, emerging trends, and opportunities for continued program enhancement.

In addition to program updates, staff will present several proposed amendments to the Rancho Cordova Municipal Code intended to improve operational effectiveness, strengthen enforcement tools, clarify existing regulations, and address emerging community concerns. These proposed code updates are designed to provide staff with more efficient and effective mechanisms to address nuisance conditions while maintaining fairness, transparency, and due

process.

The work session will also provide an opportunity to discuss the city's current code enforcement philosophy and how that philosophy guides service delivery. Rancho Cordova's approach to code enforcement is founded on the principle of voluntary compliance whenever possible. Staff prioritizes education, communication, and partnership with residents and property owners to achieve lasting compliance before pursuing formal enforcement actions. However, when voluntary compliance cannot be achieved, the city utilizes progressive enforcement strategies that are consistent, equitable, and focused on protecting the health, safety, and welfare of the community.

As the City of Rancho Cordova continues to grow and evolve, the Neighborhood Services Department must continually evaluate its programs, policies, and ordinances to ensure they remain responsive to changing community needs. This work session is intended to provide the City Council with a comprehensive overview of current operations, identify opportunities for continuous improvement, and solicit policy direction regarding future enhancements to neighborhood preservation efforts. The discussion will also reinforce the city's commitment to balancing education, customer service, and accountability while preserving the character and livability of Rancho Cordova's neighborhoods.

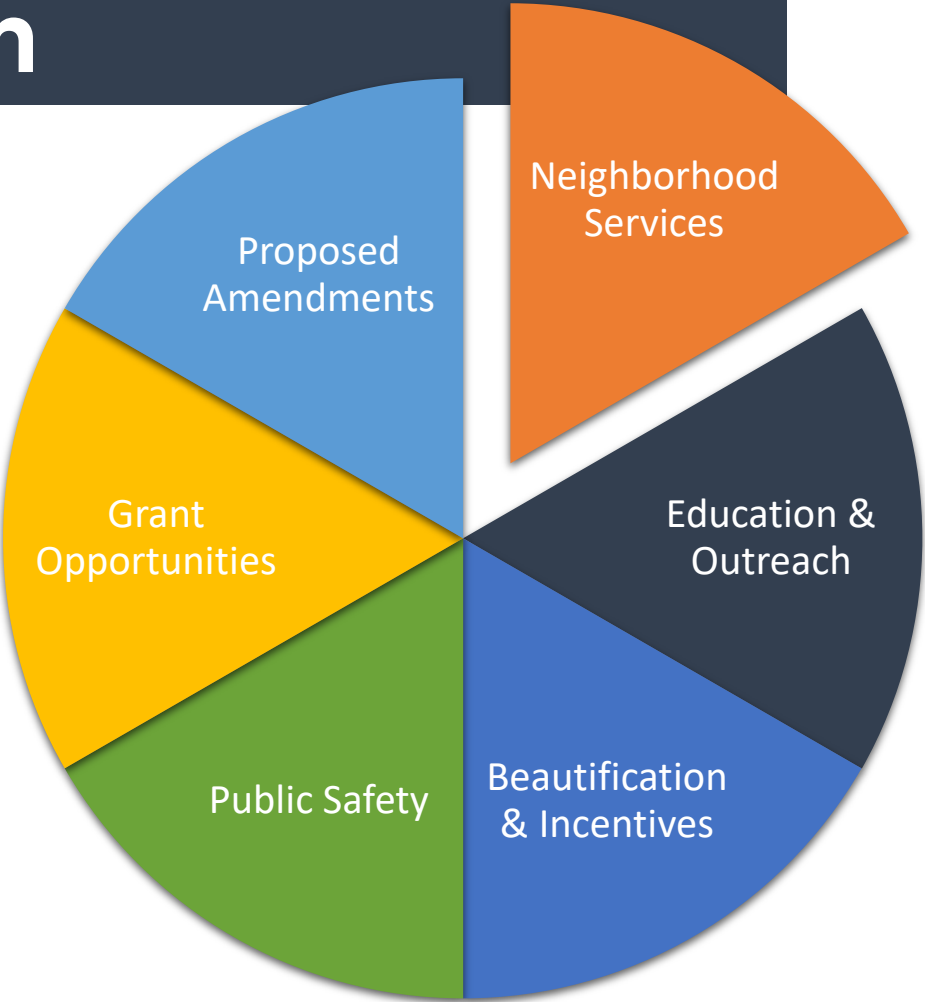

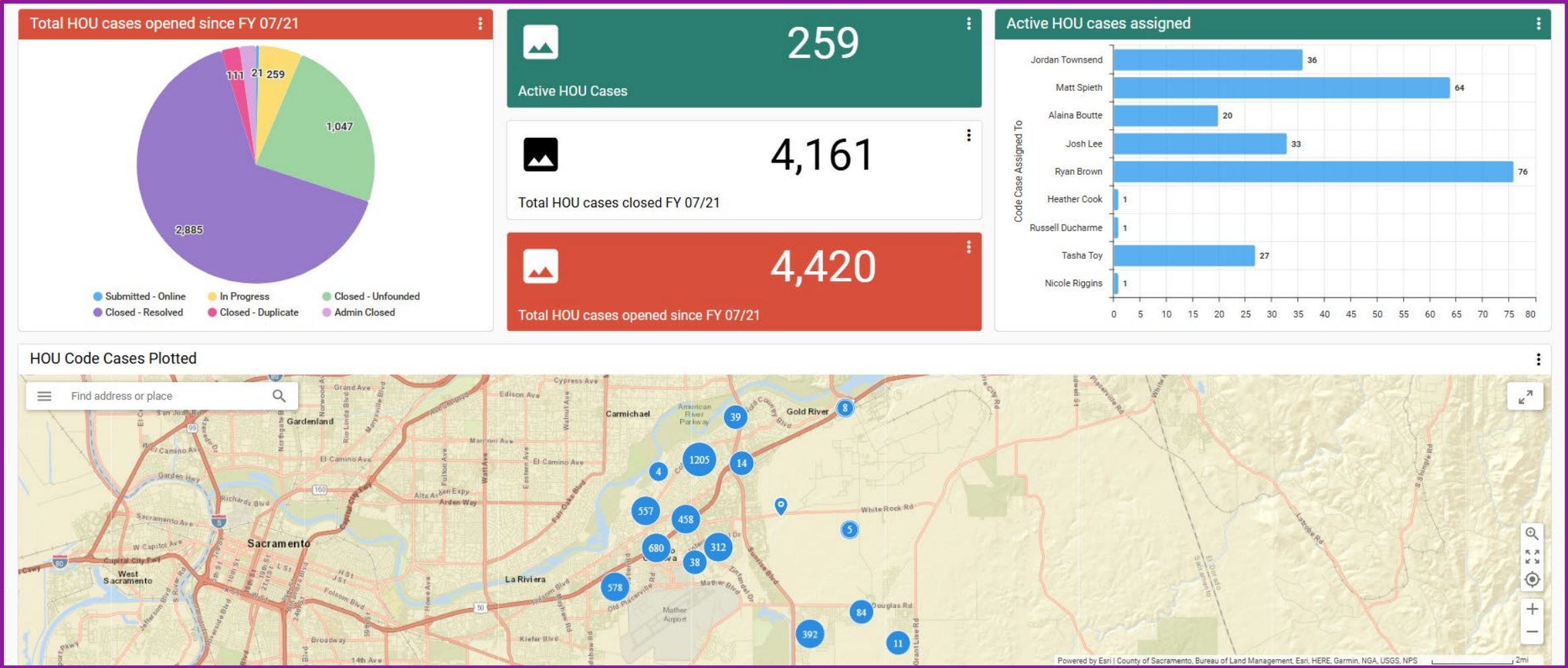

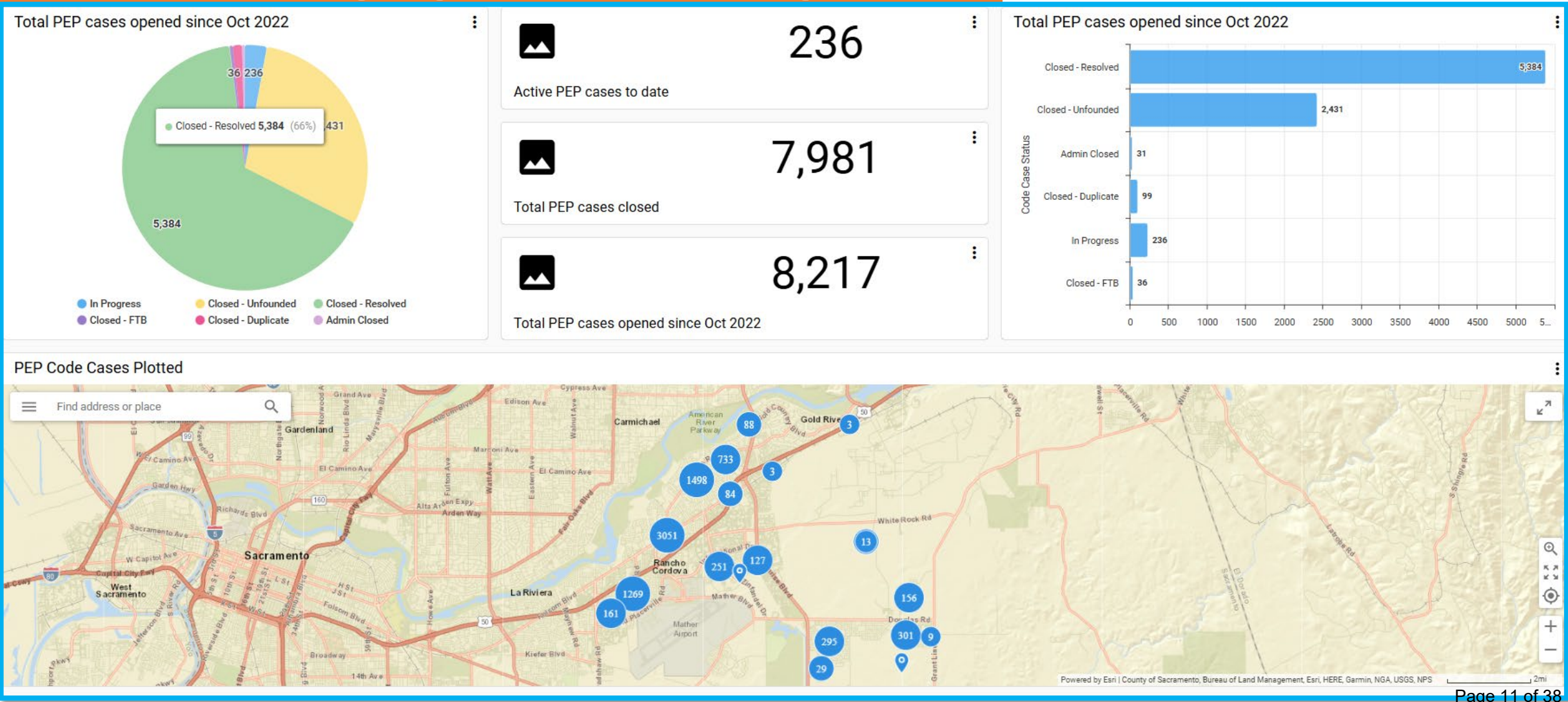

Proactive Engagement Program

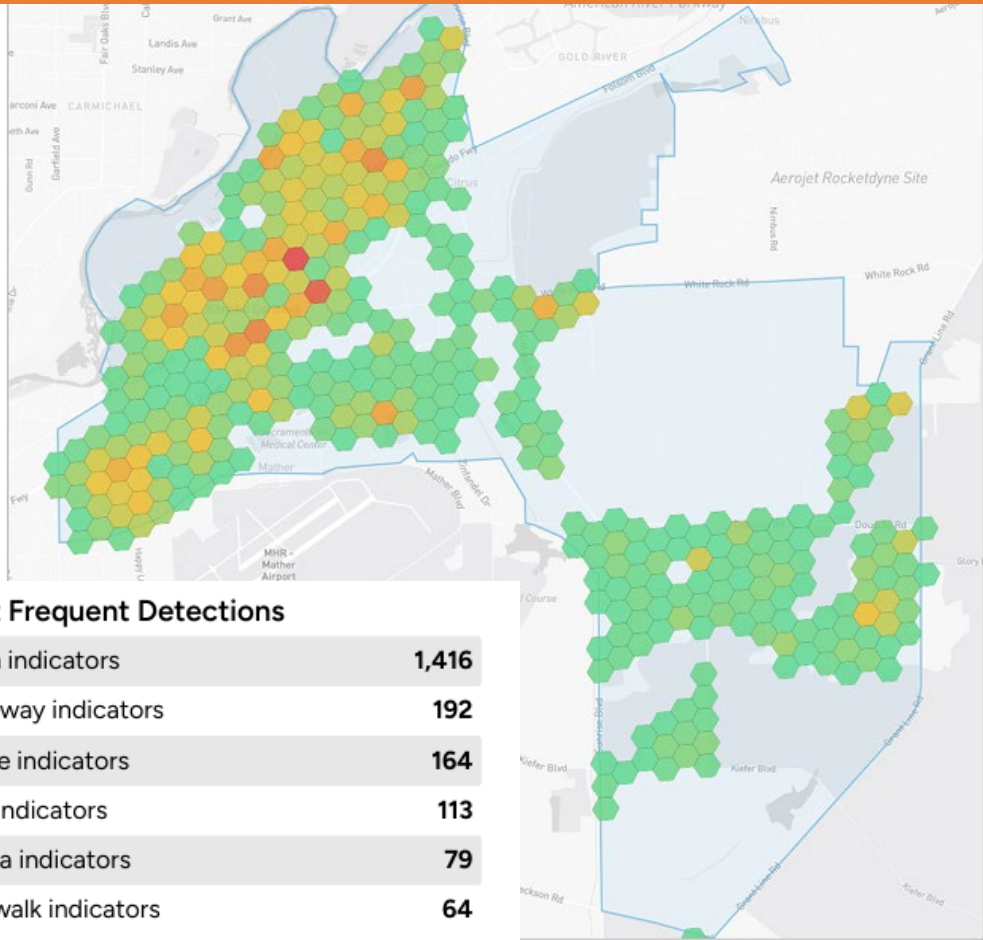

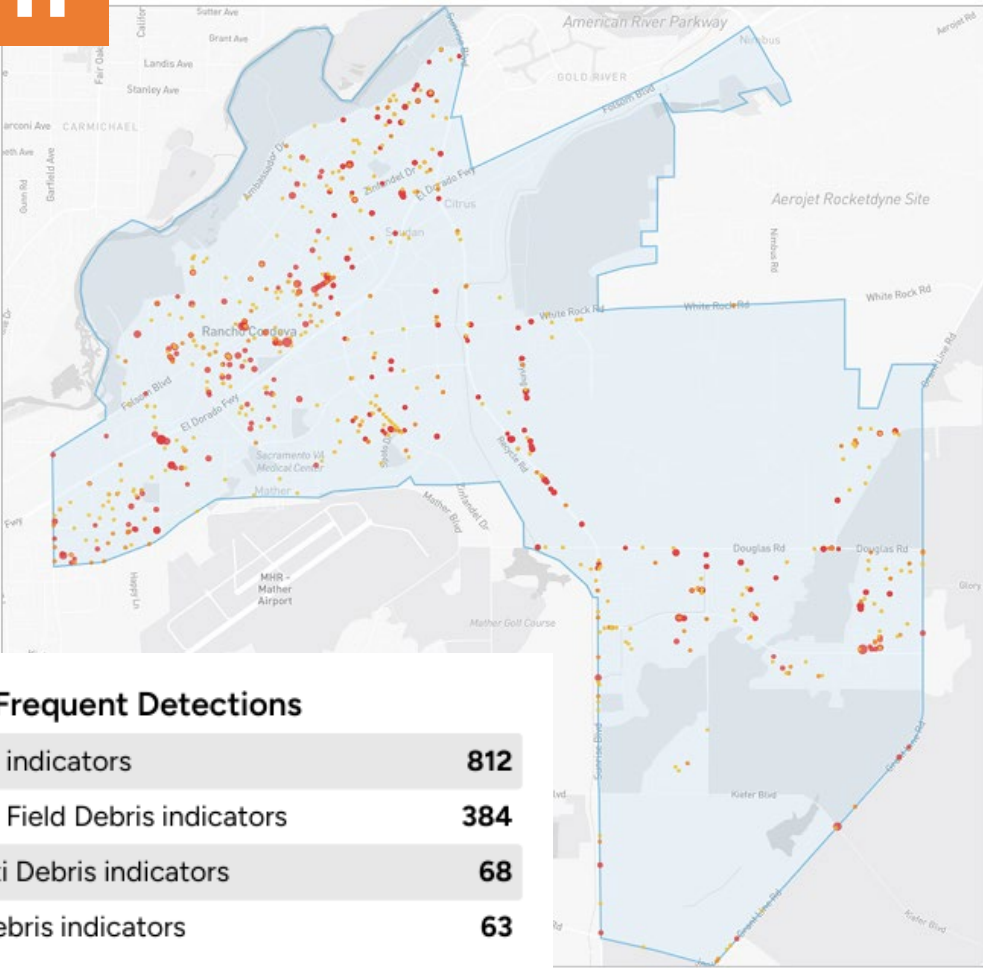

If the property remains in violation, a Notice and Order will be issued, providing another 30 days to comply. However, ongoing unaddressed and uncorrected violations will result in enforcement action, which could include administrative citations, fines, costs and penalties.

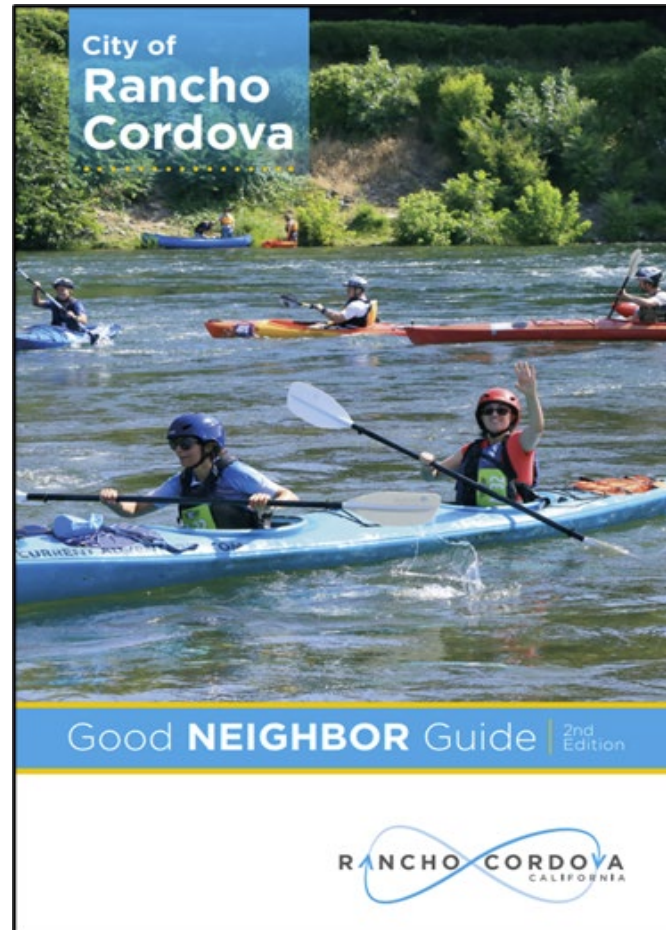

We have good news for you!

The City of Rancho Cordova provides a grant of up to \$1,000 to remove chain link fencing and make related yard and landscaping improvements. Both owner-occupied and rental properties qualify for this program.

The three-step process is easy!

2. We will review your application and contact you once you are approved for removal.
3. You will receive your reimbursement once the chain link fence is removed.

 It is important to bring proof of all current vaccinations, including rabies, to the clinic.
 A California ID or photo ID with a utility bill, rental/lease agreement, or home ownership document indicating residency at a Rancho Cordova address must be present in order to participate in this clinic.

ANIMAL LICENSE APPLICATION

City ordinance requires all dogs and cats over 4 months old to be vaccinated against rabies and licensed with the city within 30 days.

As of July 1, 2021: Thanks to the city's Community Enhancement & Investment Fund, there is no charge for pet licenses at this time. Please continue to fill out the pet license application so city staff can review your pet's current rabies vaccination and issue a complimentary license that will last through the expiration date of the vaccination.

- Enclose proof of spay/neuter** for the pet if not already on file. Failure to include proof of the rabies vaccine will delay issuance of a pet license.
- A metal tag will be mailed out for first time licensing.** The metal tag you received with your first license is permanently assigned to your pet. If a new tag is needed, please indicate the pet needs a new tag and enclose the replacement tag fee.

BE WATER WISE

It's no secret that California has had successive dry winters and is now in a drought. You can help reduce water use with a few new habits.

Save Water in Your Home

- Take five-minute showers or fill your bathtub halfway or less
- Turn off the water when shaving and brushing your teeth
- Fix leaks around your house
- Install high-efficiency toilets
- Wash full loads of clothes and dishes
- Catch indoor water from showers and sinks to irrigate your garden

Save Water in Your Yard

- Use a broom instead of water to clean outdoor areas
- Install drip irrigation and add a smart controller
- Adjust sprinkler heads and fix leaks
- Use mulch around plants to retain moisture
- Reimagine your yard with drought-resistant plants
- Set mower blades to 3" to encourage deeper roots

Save Your Trees

- Prioritize watering your trees
- Use four to six inches of mulch to retain moisture
- Water with slow soaks to avoid run-off
- Limit pruning and fertilizing during dry seasons

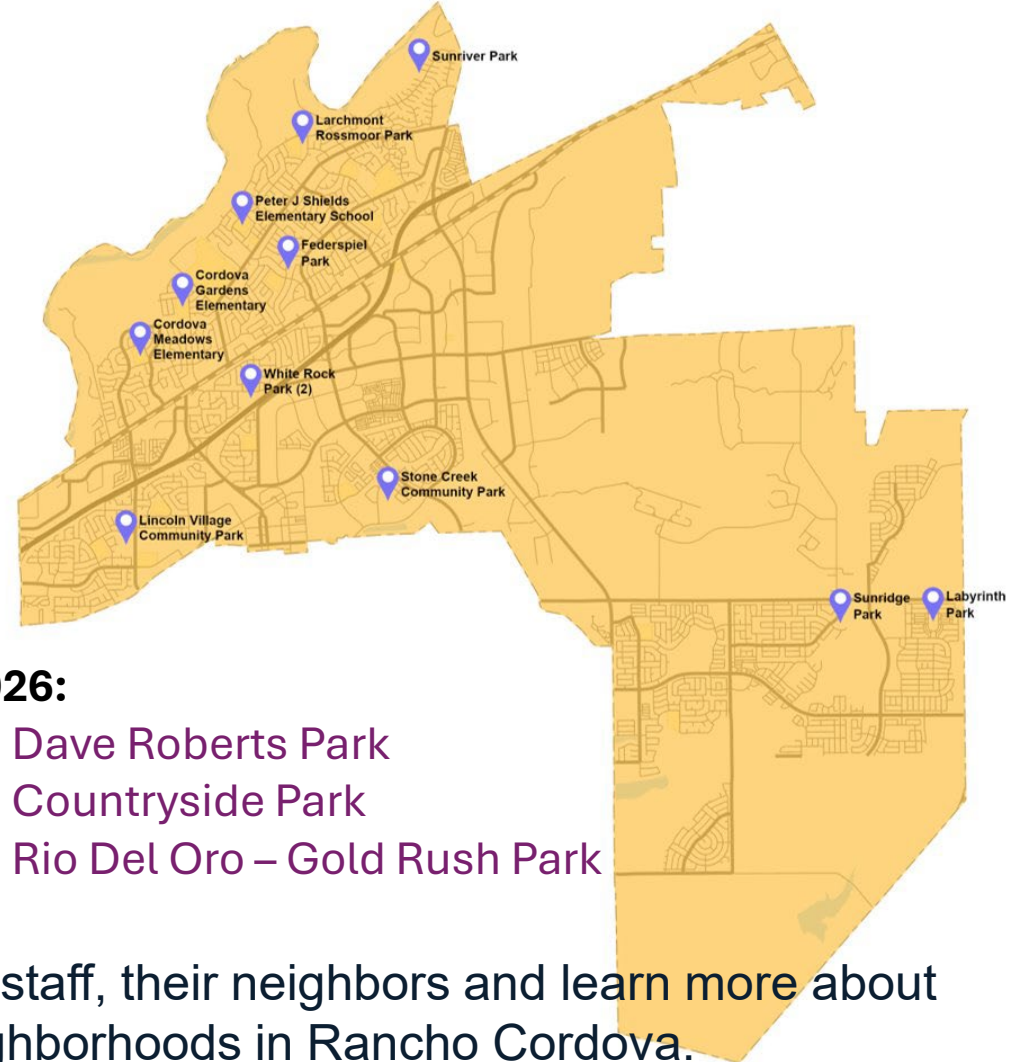

Fence Maintenance

A sturdy new fence will last many years if you keep up on maintenance. Here's how.

- Staining your fence can increase its longevity by protecting it from the weather. Reach out to your contractor or visit your nearest home repair store for a recommendation on an all-weather fence stain.
- Inspect your fence regularly and look for any damaged areas, loose boards, nails or screws. If you see any damage, replace the board, nail or screw so the fence stays sturdy and secure.
- You may also want to clean the fence. Washing the fence periodically will help remove dirt, mold, or mildew that can negatively impact the look of the fence and shorten its lifespan.



Removal of Junk and Debris

It's all about keeping up with the clutter before it becomes an overwhelming job.

Make it a habit to clear leaves, branches, trash, or other debris from your front and side yard. This prevents clutter from accumulating and keeps the space looking tidy. If you accumulate any junk or debris over time, try to dispose of it quickly, either through a waste disposal service or by using designated collection bins.

For larger items, schedule a bulky item pick up with Atlas Disposal.

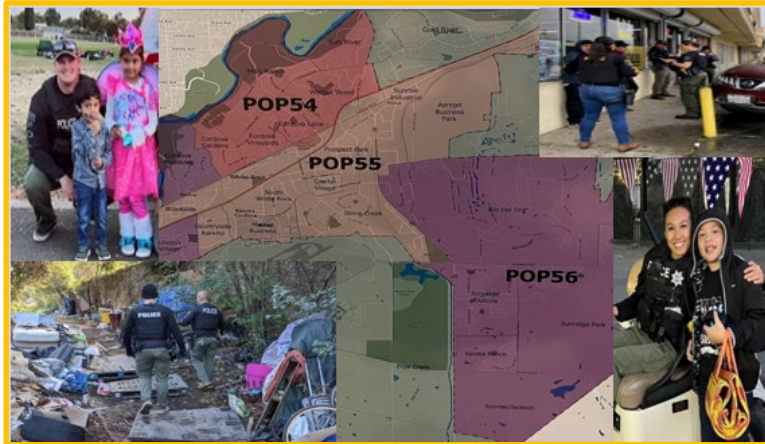

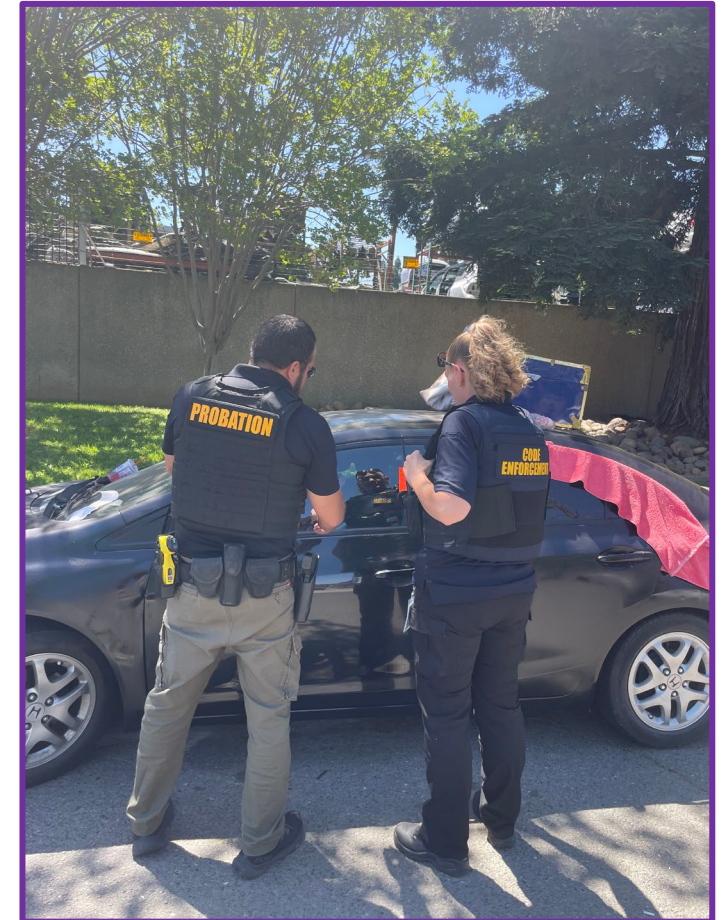

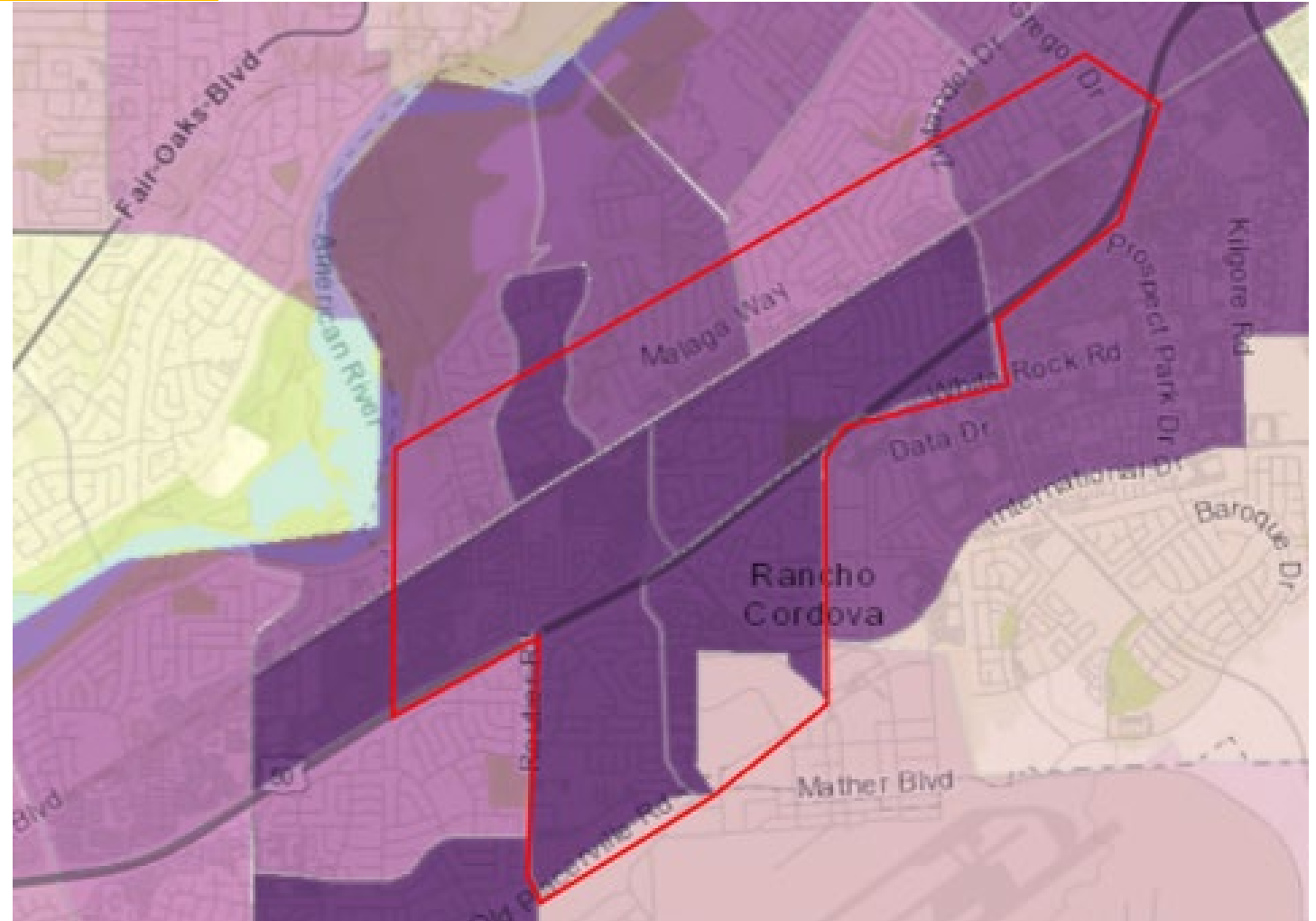
Grant Opportunities

Transformative Climate Communities (TCC) Grant Opportunity

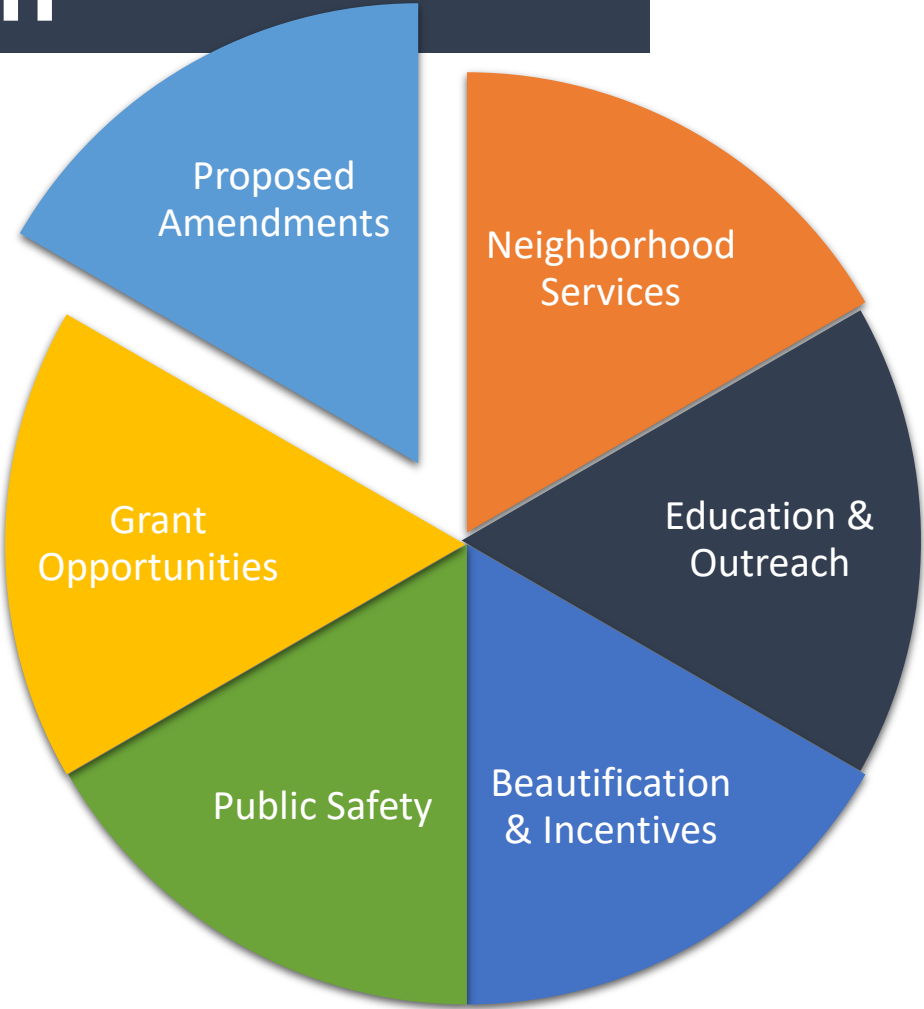
- TCC supports community-driven projects that reduce greenhouse gas emissions while improving quality of life
- **Up to \$27.5 million** available for a single Implementation Grant award
- Approximately **\$82.5 million** available statewide for **three Implementation Grants** in Round 6
- Project Area must include at least 51% of area in top 25% of disadvantaged CalEnviroScreen 4.0 census tracts
- Round 6 applications are due by September 30, 2026

Grant Opportunities

- Strongest eligible area in Rancho Cordova centers around Folsom Boulevard (see map)
- Funds coordinated investments such as:
 - Affordable housing
 - Active transportation and transit
 - Urban greening and parks
 - Renewable energy and resilience
 - Workforce development and economic opportunity
- Because of the short application window and extensive community and partner engagement required, there is a strong chance our effort may turn into a 2-year effort with a stronger application in Round 7 in 2027

Proposed Amendments

Increase Administrative Penalties

- Current enforcement and citation process is \$100, \$200, \$500 for most violations
- Suggested increase in fines: \$250, \$500, \$1,000
 - Creates stronger deterrent for repeat violations
 - Better reflects costs of enforcement and staff resources
 - Supports public safety by increased accountability
 - Overall Code Enforcement philosophy shift

Temporary Use Permits

Exempt Activities

- Garage/Yard Sales
- Emergency Facilities
- Fireworks Stands
- Portable Storage Containers: 60-day max

Permit Required

- Construction Office/Sales Trailer
- Outdoor storage/sales/displays
- Temporary signs – banners, flags, etc.
- Grand opening event/special day or weekend events

Temporary Use Permits

- Current enforcement and citation process is the same regardless of the TUP activity.
- History indicates that the most issues arise from events with condition violations or not obtaining a TUP.
- Suggest a tiered approach to place events in a different enforcement/citation level than all other TUP activities.
 - Rename event TUP to Special Event TUP's.

Animal Code

- Modify timelines to align with Shelter SOPs
 - Stray holds
- Clarify the Potentially Dangerous and Vicious Animal designation through added definitions and requirements
- Align current processes with modified state requirements
 - Sales of animals in public spaces
 - Minimum age requirement to received rabies vaccines
